1. The setting (36)

When? **Sunday** evening on Resurrection Day!

Where? In Jerusalem behind locked doors (John 20:19)

Who? **Disciples (apostles and others)** (Luke 24:9-10, 33)

2. The purpose (37-43)

“Peace *be with you.*”

(startled, frightened, troubled, doubting, joyful, amazed)

Jesus' **bodily** resurrection is real. He's alive!

3. The lesson (44-47, see also 26-27)

Moses, the Prophets, the Psalms

Luke 16:29-31 “They have Moses and the Prophets”

John 5:39, 46 “Moses wrote about me” (Jesus speaking)

Acts 8:32-35 “Beginning with that very passage . . .”

He opened their minds to understand, more than **“Aha!”**

Messiah had to suffer *and* to rise *and* to be **preached**

Repentance and forgiveness of sins in His name

(def. a change of thinking, feeling and behavior)

To all nations, beginning at Jerusalem

4. The promise (48)

Jesus needs **witnesses** (Acts 2:32; 4:20; 10:41)

Witnesses need **power** (Acts 1:8)
