## A Word of Warning to Wannabe Disciples

Matthew 7:21-23

October 23, 2022

<sup>21</sup> "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. <sup>22</sup> Many will say to me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name and in your name drive out demons and in your name perform many miracles?' <sup>23</sup> Then I will tell them plainly, 'I never knew you. Away from me, you evildoers!'"

- 1. Context—this comes just after Jesus warned about false prophets and good trees/fruit vs. bad trees/fruit
- 2. Structure—statement (21); objection (22); response (23)
- 1. Statement of warning, not a threat

a. Not everyone
b. Who says to me
c. Lord, Lord
d. But
universal salvation is not a thing
Jesus is the King we will face knowing the right password there's hope in this warning

e. Only the onef. Who doesindividual responseobeys in a practical way

g. The will of my Father, not doing their own will (John 6:38)

h. Who is in the heaven(s), here and now surrounding us

## 2. Objection

a. Many will say this is a common objection
b. To me Jesus is the King we will face
c. On that day the day of final judgment

d. Lord, Lord still coming with respectful words

e. In your name, using his name to make a name for themselves

f. Didn't we prophesy, cast out demons, do many miracles?

## 3. Response

- a. Then I will tell them plainly, direct speech without softening it
- b. I never knew you, no evidence of a prior relationship
- c. Away from me, Jesus will have nothing more to do with them
- d. You evildoers, "lawbreakers" not doing God's will

Faith, too, accepts the challenge of morality, but only as an occasion to become the instrument of God's power.
