1. God's people have his **DNA** (14-16a)

Do not be yoked together with unbelievers (2Cor. 6:14)

- Righteousness vs. wickedness
 God's righteousness (Rom. 3:21-22; 2 Cor. 5:21)
- Light vs. darkness
 God is light (John 8:12; 1 John 1:5-7)
- Christ vs. Belial ie. worthless
 Christ is worthy (Rev. 4:11 and 5:9)
- Believer vs. dis-believer
 Believe God = <u>trust</u> God (Rom. 4:5, 20-21)
- Temple of God vs. idols ie. <u>substitute</u> gods God's indwelling Spirit (1 Cor. 3:16)

There is no space for compromise, partnership, or sharing with false teachers, false worship and false living in the church!

- 2. God pursues an exclusive relationship w/ His people (16b-18)
 - a. His <u>presence</u> with His redeemed ones
 See also Lev. 26:11-12 and Ezek. 37:27 and Rev. 21:3
 - b. His particular concern for their set apart lifestyle
 - c. The Lord Almighty's heart for His sons and daughters
- 3. God's people respond to His promises (7:1)
 - a. Redemption has both a "from" and also a "to" aspect
 Redeemed from sin and redeemed to holiness
 - b. "Aggressively and progressively" (RWP) wholy holy
