Daniel 9:4-19

An outline of Daniel's prayer in Daniel 9:4-19

- 4-6** 1) Lord God, we've violated the terms of your covenant of love
See Deuteronomy 7:9-12
- 7-11a** 1a) God you are righteous and we are **humiliated**
"What were we thinking?"
- 11b-14** 1b) We are suffering justly and you are right to punish us
*"This **mess** is our fault, not God's." (Dt. 28:15)*
- 15-16** 2) Lord God, you built your reputation on saving sinners
*People like **us** ; Daniel uses plural pronouns "we/us"*
- 17-19** 3) God please act and forgive again for the sake of your Name
See 1 John 1:9

Principles of prayer from Daniel 9

- Daniel read his Bible (Daniel 9:2)
- Bible reading led Daniel to pray about God's **promises**
- The more I focus on God's character, the clearer I see my sin
- My sin does not have the final say, God **does**
- Confession does not **create** forgiveness, God does
- Even 'righteous' Daniel confessed his sins **with** the people
- Temporary **relief** (Prov. 28:13) was available in the OT
- Forgiveness in Christ is forever and free by grace through faith
- Repentant faith in Christ Jesus keeps our relationship **close**

Adoration of God naturally moves into . . .

Confession of sin moves into . . .

Thanksgiving for God's forgiveness moves into . . .

Supplication is asking from our restored relationship with God
